Paul tells them to examine themselves to see if they truly have faith. If they do have faith, they should prove it by turning away from their wicked deeds. Paul's prayer is that they would stop the sin, be honest, and keep themselves pure. His purpose in writing to them was not to destroy them but to make them strong in their faith. At the end of Paul's letter, he encourages them to be of one mind according to the Spirit of God, to be at peace and to greet one another with purity. These are good for us to practice also—unity, peace and purity.

DOUBTS

There may be times that we doubt the goodness of God, the power of God, the love of God or the promises of God. The doubting Christian takes his eyes off the person of Christ, and he loses sight of the Almighty God, who says, "All things work together for good to them that love God . . . according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). One of the grieving survivors of the devastating earthquake in Haiti began to doubt the goodness of God. She took her Bible and threw it into the flames that engulfed the surrounding rubble. Peter, the disciple of Jesus, was walking on the sea to go to Jesus. Peter's doubts overtook his faith, and he took his eyes off the Lord Jesus. He looked at the troubled waters around him, and he began to sink in the waves. He called out, "Lord, save me!" Immediately, Jesus stretched out His hand to rescue Peter. When Peter knew he was in the hands of Jesus, all his doubts were dissolved. If circumstances in our lives have caused us to doubt God, we need to act as Peter did and turn to the Lord, not away from Him. As we read God's Word and spend time alone with the Lord, He will reassure us, enabling us to follow Him, doubting nothing.
