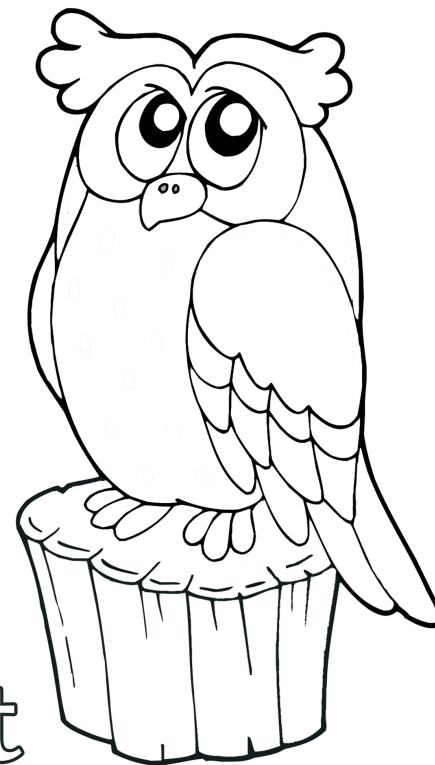

FEARING THE LORD

Not long ago, we talked about being afraid and that we can live a life free from fear. However, we should fear the Lord. Fearing the Lord is to have a holy reverence and awe of God. We learn to fear the Lord as we realize how sinful we are by nature and how holy God is. In Proverbs 8:13, we find that we also need to hate evil in order to fear the Lord. In addition, Proverbs 2:5 says, "Then shalt thou understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God," so we need to know more of God. One thing we learn about God is that He is both just and loving, so we can safely confide in Him. When we truly fear and trust the Lord and when we put our expectations in the Lord alone, then we can have security and freedom from anxiety. "In the fear of the Lord is strong confidence: and his children shall have a place of refuge" (Proverbs 14:26). In Isaiah 33:6, we receive the promise that the fear of the Lord will be our treasure.
