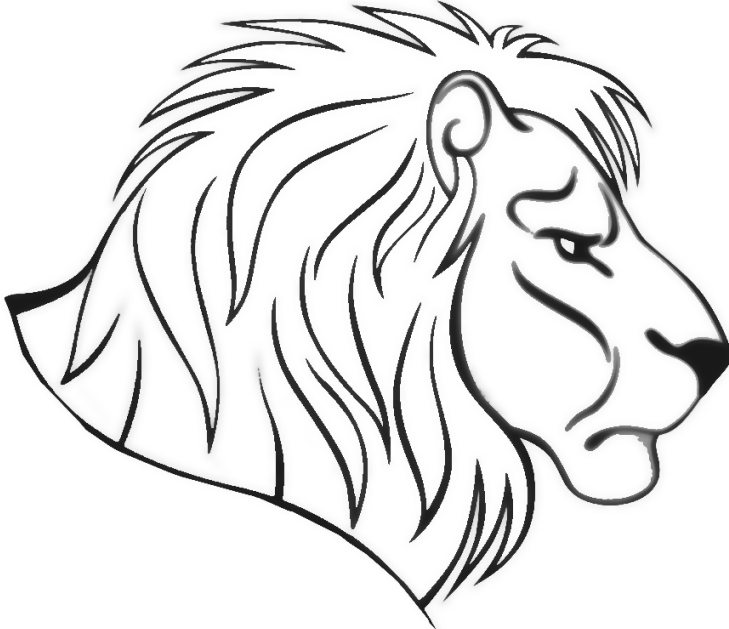

ALWAYS

Have you ever noticed how many times the Apostle Paul uses the word *always* in his epistles? At least six times he tells the other saints that he *always* remembers to pray for them. Another five times or more the Apostle Paul thanks God *always* for his fellow Christians. This should be a reminder to us to spend time not only in prayer and requests for our fellow saints but also with thankfulness in our hearts for them. Sometimes the word *always* encourages us when it is used in connection with a promise, as in 2 Corinthians 5:6 where we find that we can *always* be confident in the Lord, whether living or dying. In 2 Corinthians 4:10, the Apostle Paul uses the word *always* to exhort us: "*Always* bearing about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life also of Jesus might be made manifest in our body." Also, we can be inspired by the Apostle Paul's desire in Philippians 1:20 that Christ would *always* be "magnified in my body, whether it be by life, or by death."
