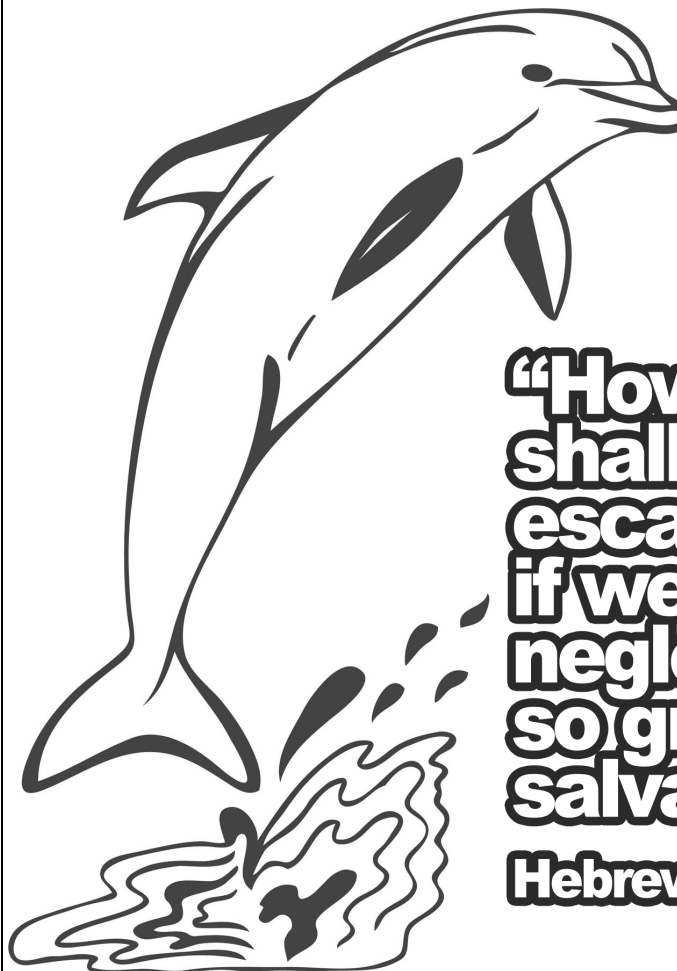

The hope of these saints was the knowledge of the Lord's coming for them. They had learned this truth through the preaching of the gospel. Since the day Paul and Timotheus heard this report, they prayed for the Colossians to learn the ways of God and live their lives to please the Lord.

With the blood of Christ we have had our sins forgiven. We have been saved from the power of Satan and sin and brought into the light of salvation. We have been brought into the kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ. We are free from the dangers of sin, death and hell.

The Lord describes all the living believers of the church as His body. The man Jesus Christ is God. He should have the first place in all things, so He is the head and we are the body.

Paul had two duties. In verse 23 we find he was a preacher of the gospel so people could be saved. Next, he was a teacher of the truth of Christ and His church. God wants all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of this truth.

GOD HIMSELF
