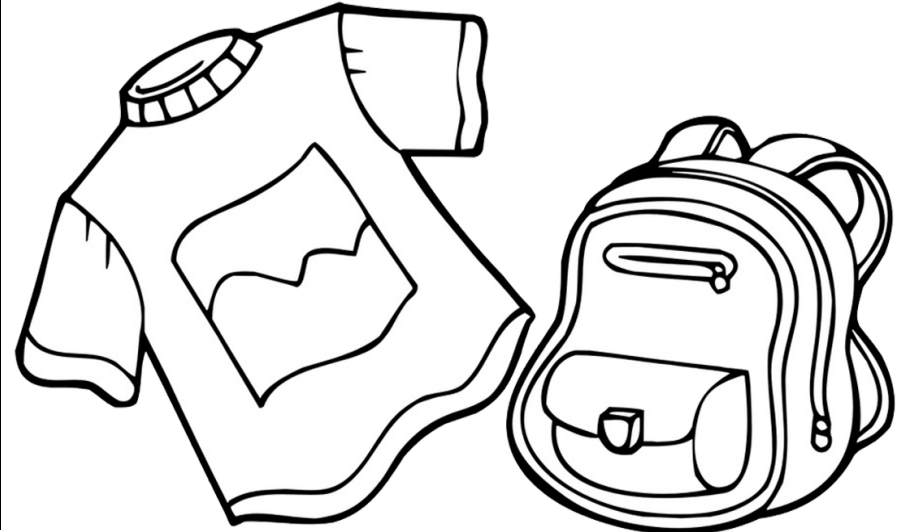

We find Paul preaching in the city of Thessalonica in Acts 17. We think he was only with them for three weeks before he was chased out of the city for teaching the Word of God. During Paul's visit he taught them much doctrine. Now he writes to encourage the Christians there. Silvanus and Timotheus joined Paul in sending their greetings. These three men gave thanks to God when they thought about these people. These Christians believed the gospel and they had faith to practice what they believed. They loved and cared for one another while they waited for the Lord to return and take them to heaven at any time. Are you waiting for Jesus? The believers of Thessalonica were sure that God had chosen them for this blessing. They were encouraged by following the good example of Paul and his friends. SEEING JESUS

Moses asked to see God's glory. But God told him that "there shall no man see Me, and live." So God covered Moses as His glory went by and God's face was not seen. John 1:18 tells us that "no man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, He hath declared Him." God the Son became a man and, consequently, His disciples and others who lived at that time were able to see Jesus, the Son of God. They could look into His eyes of love, see His expressions of care, and communicate face to face. The fact that people could look at the One who created them is amazing. Right now we are unable to see Jesus except through the eyes of faith, but we can look forward to that day when He will call us home.
