They did not start independent churches, but they were obedient to keep this unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. Paul had tried to visit them a second time but Satan hindered him from coming to them. The Christians in Thessalonica received the gospel and were then persecuted by their own countrymen. Their faithfulness to God brought joy to Paul and his friends.

PRECIOUS

Seven times the Apostle Peter uses the word *precious* in his two epistles. Precious means valuable, prized or esteemed. Four times the word *precious* is used in connection with the Lord in 1 and 2 Peter. God highly esteems His Son. His value to God is inestimable. In fact, 1 Peter 2:4 says that the Lord was "chosen of God, and precious." Do we consider the Lord Jesus precious? Do we value the Lord Jesus, His love and His death for us? Is it apparent in our lives that the Lord Jesus is precious to us? When something is precious to us, our lives and choices revolve around that object. We think of precious stones as rare gems and they are valued because of their scarcity. In this sense also, Jesus is precious. There is no one else like Him. If we try to imagine life without Jesus Christ, we may begin to understand how precious Christ actually is to us. Truly the Lord is "the chiefest among ten thousand" and "altogether lovely" (Song of Solomon 5:10,16).
